


Fostering Lifelong Learning through Digital Curriculum in Saskatchewan

The Challenge

In early 2010, it became evident to the leadership team at the Holy Trinity Catholic School Division that they needed to re-evaluate how to deliver instructional materials that address the needs of today's students and the realities of today's changing classroom.

The Solution - Digital Content Aligned to the Curriculum

"With the analog world you are stuck in time and you have resources that were manufactured at a particular point in time," said Celeste York, Director of Education. "With digital resources, they can constantly be updated and we have instant access in all of our classrooms." When they set out to research digital resource options, Holy Trinity leadership quickly realized that they had discovered something unique with Discovery Education. After further evaluation, it was determined that Discovery Education was the solution for curriculum-relevant digital classroom resources that support Holy Trinity's goals of increased student engagement, igniting students' passion for science, and fostering 21st century learning. Furthermore, with prior investments in classroom hardware, including interactive whiteboards, the benefit of a complete implementation of Discovery Education were obvious.



Year 1 - Initial Results

Students Accessing Resources Twice as Much as Teachers

The feedback from teachers and students across the division is highly enthusiastic. "Preliminary results tell us that our teachers and our students are accessing these resources at an accelerated rate, we're hearing that the resources are relevant and current, students are really engaged," Celeste York said. Usage data indicates that students are fueling a passion for learning by accessing Discovery Education resources twice as much as educators within Holy Trinity.



High login rates and interest demonstrate teachers have begun to successfully embed Discovery Education resources into their lesson plans. In an early division-wide survey, 70% of educator respondents agreed that Discovery Education resources are extremely important in promoting 21st-century learning and 64% agreed that Discovery Education resources promote 21st-century learning.
